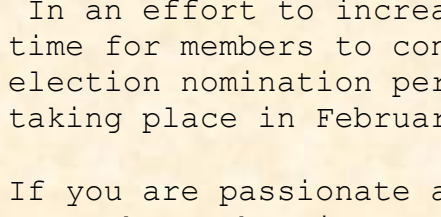

ANTSHE Annual Elections Period Begins NOW!

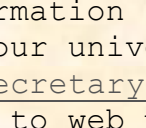
In an effort to increase participation and allow more time for members to consider serving, we have opened our election nomination period, with our annual elections taking place in February 2010.

ANTSHE LISTSERV— There seems to be some confusion on how the ANTSHE-L listserv works. Here are some quick tips:

- If you hit REPLY on your email, your reply goes to the ENTIRE LIST
- If you wish to email the originator use the 'on behalf of' address (which is at the end of each FROM line in the original email)
- **Do not use REPLY** to remove yourself from the list.
- **To remove yourself you must send an email with a message SIGNOFF ANTSHE-L to LISTSERVE@LISTSERV.OKSTATE.EDU**
(note: this is a different address than where normal postings come from)

Please be more vigilant about how you manage your participation using this valuable sharing tool. While we monitor postings for appropriateness, we allow members to customize their own functionalities including self removals.
