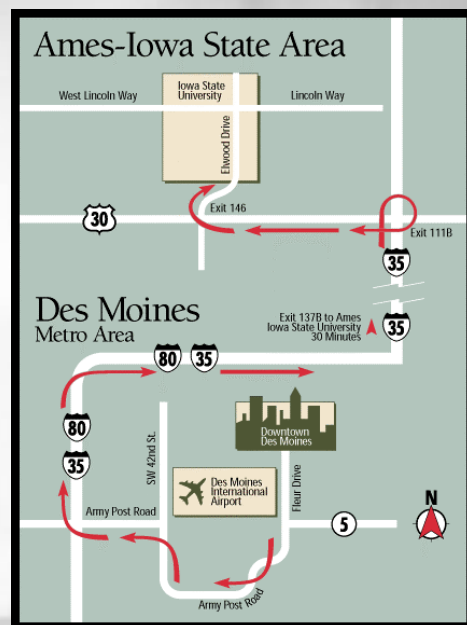
Conference Information

By Plane

The Des Moines International Airport (www.dsmaairport.com) is approximately 45 minutes from Ames. Many major airlines fly into Des Moines. Check the airport World Wide Web site for rental car information. A shuttle will run between the airport and Gateway Center on Friday, March 23 and Sunday,

March 25. Check the transportation box on your registration form and you will be contacted for your flight information. The shuttle cost is for \$40/round-trip.

By Car

Centrally located in the Midwest, Ames is easily accessed by transcontinental U.S. Highways 30 and 69, as well as Interstate 35. Interstate 80 is just 25 miles south of Ames. Minneapolis is only 218 miles away, Chicago 322 miles, Omaha 168 miles, and Kansas City 220 miles.
